PIN 2ND QUARTER 2012 SUMMARY REPORT



Ajegunle Innovation Centre (AJIC)

Paradigm Initiative Nigeria's Ajegunle Innovation Centre (AJIC), supported by Microsoft's Community Technology Skills Project (CTSP) is now open at 39, Baale Street, Ajegunle, Lagos. The application process for the first session of the training at the AJIC was open to Ajegunle community from the 16th of April 2012, and the deadline for the submission of forms was 14th May. Volunteer trainers were also contacted during this period and after a brief orientation for first time volunteers, they were billed to take specific classes during the session. The final interview and selection process took place on the 18th of May, 2012. By Monday, 28th April 2012, the first training session at the centre took off with 19 students present for the training out of the 20 who were selected of 44 candidates who applied. The first training session at the AJIC commenced on 28th May 2012 and is scheduled to end July 6th 2012.

Three sessions are billed to hold at the Innovation Centre by the end of the year. The Centre will serve as a knowledge hub where the youth of the community can be empowered for the world of work. It will serve the purpose of training, incubation and service provision.

Visitors at the brand new AJIC in the second quarter include Arvind Kris of the United States Consulate, who visited the centre on May 17, 2012, and promised the continued support of the Consulate for the Ajegunle.org project in the areas of internships and supplies of books to our library. Members of the International Republican Institute visited the centre on 15th June. They spent four hours in the facility in a pre-scheduled interview session with Mr. 'Gbenga Sesan, the Executive Director of Paradigm Initiative Nigeria, and also spoke with some of the students and members of the community. Dr. Seyi Adebayo-Olubi, a member of the PIN board was at the centre on 15th June. Jacqui Deelstra from Creative Associates International visited on 22nd June. In her own words, "I really enjoyed seeing the work of the centre live and getting your perspective on education, youth and development in Nigeria."

Our partners continue to support our work tremendously by providing internship opportunities for our graduates. Two of our graduates, Paul Ighorodje and Michael Alabi, resumed their internship with the Public Affairs Section of the US Embassy in Lagos. Also during the quarter, Martha Ezeocha joined AITEO Energies Limited and Onyejiekwe Calystus joined DHL. Funke Alao and Bukola Oseni are still with UK Trade & Investment at the UK Deputy High Commission while George Owunari completed his internship at DHL during the same period. 2 of our students who completed their internships have now been engaged by DHL as full-time staff. Staff of the US Consulate and Public Affairs Section also hosted training sessions with alumni of Ajegunle.org, and some were selected for additional IT training (basic programming).

TENT (Techie. Entrepreneurial. Nigerian. Talented)

TENT is an acronym for **TECHIE. ENTREPRENEURAL. NIGERIAN. TALENTED.** TENT is a platform that fills an existing gap by providing a place where budding Nigerian *technopreneurs* can showcase their work, connect with resources, add value to market and inspire innovation, while building a sustainable business that they will run after graduation. PIN commenced hosting *TENT* Workshops across Nigeria in 2011 (Warri, May 2011), which continues through 2012 (Uyo and Minna) in preparation for a multi-day event, the annual *TENT* Gathering, which will hold December 10-12, 2012. TENT will search for unconnected tech enthusiasts who have the potential of building on globally accessible technology products or leading a new product development cycle for local companies.

On Monday 30th April 2012, not only did the formal signing ceremony of the Memorandum of Understanding between the prestigious Obafemi Awolowo University IIe – Ife and Paradigm initiative Nigeria take place, all ninety-nine first year students of the Computer Science and Technology department in attendance signed up for the **TENT@GreatIfe** program. The pilot TENT activity in the Computer Science department of Obafemi Awolowo University will feed into the annual event by providing a dedicated example of what young people can do with technology, especially with under supportive conditions.

Speaking at the formal signing ceremony; the Head of the Department of Computer Science and Engineering, Professor Adagunodo, congratulated the students and described them as fortunate pioneers. TENT at Great Ife is much more than a special elective course because it allows the students to graduate with a certificate in learning and culture in one hand and technopreneurship in the other." I congratulate the host HOD for being a pioneer and I thank Paradigm Initiative Nigeria for reaching out to our university."

The ICT training, networking and information sharing event for non-governmental organizations tagged *Microsoft NGO Connection Day* held on 14th June 2012 with over 60 non-governmental organizations represented. Although the connection day held in Lagos, there were in attendance non-governmental organizations from neighbouring states like Ogun and Oyo as well as from the Niger Delta, and the North Central regions.

The training was facilitated by Mr. 'Gbenga Sesan, the Executive Director of PIN and covered such topics as Computer Basics, Internet and the World Wide Web, Computer Security and Privacy, Social Media, among others. The General Manager of Microsoft Anglophone West Africa, Mr. Emmanuel Onyeje in rounding off the day's training, appreciated the attendees for their participation in the forum, recognizing their selfless service to communities through various innovations.

Many of the participants opined that they found the training most useful. According to Endurance Aitanum from the Catholic Action Committee on HIV/AIDS (CACA) in Katsina; "I found all the sessions very helpful especially the training on the use of Social Media Tools. You should think of bringing this initiative down to the North because a lot of non-governmental organizations are going to benefit from it." Like most other participants, he requested to have the soft copy of the slides used in the training sent to his mail box so as to use in re-training other members of his organization.
