

# WHAT TO DO IF SOCIAL MEDIA, SPECIFIC WEBSITES OR THE INTERNET IS BLOCKED IN NIGERIA

As the Nigerian 2019 elections approach, there is the possibility of social media and internet shutdowns. If and when shutdowns happen, Paradigm Initiative recommends these steps to take in an event of website blockages, social media shutdown, and internet shutdowns.




# 1. TO CIRCUMVENT OR ACCESS BLOCKED WEBSITES

### Install TOR browser



Tor Browser will allow you to access blocked websites and to surf the web anonymously https://www.torproject.org/download/download.html

## Download trusted Virtual Private Networks (VPNs) to access blocked websites and apps





# 2. VERIFY AND TEST BLOCKED WEBSITES, APPS, AND SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORMS

Testing for website censorship is important for the media freedom community. Censorship activities flourish when they are not documented and exposed.

# Install the OONI app to test for blocked websites



Make sure to turn off your VPN before testing for blocked websites using OOni

### 3. WHAT IF THE INTERNET IS COMPLETELY SHUT DOWN?

- If the entire Internet is shut down, it is important to keep other lines of communications like telephone, SMS text, and radio open.
- Even if there's complete internet outage, you can **set-up to update your Facebook and Twitter using SMS.**To enable SMS updates on Twitter, follow these steps:
